NEWS OF THE CLAN SOCIETY

Our inaugural meeting elected a steering committee in March and after some hesitation it has been decided to adopt a formal constitution which will be presented to a meeting early in 1984 rather than to seek incorporation which carries it with it some financial and reporting burdens.

In June, a representative meeting of the Society was greatly informed and entertained by John Barth V.P. of the Genealogical Society of Victoria who provided a great deal of information concerning Genealogical Research in Scotland covering such sources as New Register House (1855 et seq); a record of Parish Registers of Scotland held by the Mormon Church in Australia, Pre 1823 Wills and the Registers of Seisin (deeds) and many others. We will publish later a fuller resume of his address.
